Building a Good "Builder-Homeowner" Relationship (Part VI - Continued from Summer 2023 Issue) - by Levi Hochstetler

#10 Did not start the project when agreed

Not starting on time is almost normal in the building trade. Builders agree, delays such as the previous project taking longer, weather delays, a death in family, or numerous other valid and some not so valid reasons can all affect scheduling.

I personally enter all new projects in our schedule book for the milling of the logs. Often, I can't enter the job as soon as the client or builder would like to have them. However, without fail, several weeks before the scheduled milling date, most of our clients and/or builders end up calling and wanting us to push out the delivery date even further. There always seems to be some culprit. Either it's the permits, utilities, weather, excavator or some other issue that sets the project back.



Plan on delays! It's almost guaranteed! Hopefully, you have a construction loan that only charges interest on money that is paid out. Make sure that there is enough time allowed to finish the home before the loan matures. Of course, there is a limit. Also, you may want to have the contract with the builder spell out the start and finish date. Perhaps you might include a special carrot on your own. Such as a fairly substantial bonus if started and ready to move in by an agreed upon date.

#11 Ripped us off.

We need to keep things in perspective. I don't want to paint a bad picture or use a scare tactic against builders as there are many, good honest builders out there. Considering the 1000's of homes we have delivered and were built, I can only think of this happening thrice to any of our clients. Yet, for these few clients it was financially devastating. So a word of caution is in order.

Financing through a bank can be a safety net in assuring you that the builder is doing what they are supposed to do. Banks are adamant in getting lean waivers before they release any additional funds. But perhaps the best preventive measure is to always have the money going directly from the bank or from you to the log mill and not channeled through a builder. At least twice of the times that I remember someone getting "ripped off" was when the homeowner paid the builder, trusting he would in turn pay us as they had agreed on. However, it didn't happen, leaving the homeowner hanging.

On one occasion, the builder got ferociously angry when I insisted that he has to have a certified check to give to the trucker for our material when it gets delivered. The madder he got and the more choice words he spat at me, the deeper I dug in. It was good that I did, because several months later we got a phone call from the homeowner, crying on our shoulder, asking if we had gotten paid. Apparently we were one of the few subs or material suppliers that had gotten paid leaving the homowner's only choice to pay double for the rest of the material. First, their initial payment to the builder for the material, and then again having to pay the subs direct!







A Meal to Remember

In the early 60's I worked in the art department of The Hoover Company in North Canton, Ohio, alongside a retouch artist. Harry was also a very accomplished watercolorist and frequently traveled to areas that were popular with artists and provided ample opportunities. Nashville, Indiana, with its breathtaking landscape, captured the imagination of artists throughout the Midwest, and in the early 1900's became the home of several famous artists.

After hearing Harry's glowing review I was intrigued with the area and decided to go there on a weekend painting trip that fall. Approaching Nashville, it was no wonder that artists found this area so appealing. Trees provided a dazzling array of reds, oranges, and golds, while farm fields added rich shades of yellows and browns. And, numerous covered bridges provided wonderful views of crystal-clear meandering streams and cascading waterfalls. A artist's "bucket list" to be sure!

As I drove along a country road I spotted a rustic log building ahead. It had been converted to a fruit stand and inside were many varieties of apples, squash and pumpkins. Outside, timbers held the porch ceiling and were surrounded by corn stalks. I was so taken by the beauty of this I

asked the owner if I could paint it. At first he was surprised that anyone would want to paint an old rundown log shack but after I explained its charm he agreed, and I quickly parked my car out front with my watercolor paper placed securely on top of the hood of my car. It was a beautiful fall day with a slight breeze and the sun cast perfect diagonal shadows across the porch, adding depth to the painting. Between customers, he would fill me in on the historical significance of the old cabin, which at one time had been some family's home. He was at work remodeling the inside and replacing some of the large stones in the century-old fireplace. As the sun started its slow descent in the west the sky became a brilliant orange and Joe suddenly appeared.


"If you don't have any plans for tonight would you like to join us for supper? Nothing special, understand."

I was surprised by his invitation and was momentarily speechless, but quickly recovered and said, "Great, love too. Let me go back to the motel and clean up and I'll see you later."

When I returned, Joe, his wife Emily, and teenage daughter, Maggie, were gathered 'round the rustic wood dining table with a large bowl of ham and bean soup, and a dish of corn bread in the center. A lantern in the corner cast a warm glow across the table and added a welcoming appeal. It suddenly seemed like a 100-year step back in time. I don't think I've ever enjoyed a meal as much as that. Maybe it was the feeling of meeting strangers who didn't seem like strangers, or a scene right out of a Norman Rockwell painting, but whatever it was, it was at once captivating and memorable.
